Bring your passion for wildlife and conservation and join our volunteer team at Durham Wildlife Trust as a **Heart of Durham Volunteer**



The Heart of Durham Project is a partnership organisation with Northumbrian Water. This means that 75% of our habitat management work is carried out on behalf of Northumbrian Water on their sites such as reservoirs, water and sewage treatment works. The other 25% of our conservation work is working on a landscape scale with farmers, land owners and community groups.

What's involved?

- Practical habitat management work is varied and includes scrub clearance, tree felling, sometimes burning, coppicing, tree planting, hedge laying, meadow raking, balsam control and bracken control.
- Construction work such as fencing, installation of bridges, steps and surfaced footpaths.
- A chance to get involved with survey work

All the above is undertaken as part of a team of volunteers led by the Heart of Durham Project Officer

What will you get out of it?

- How to use a range of hand tools
- About habitat management and conservation for wildlife

- Gain practical management skills
